

Conference Budget Request: \$53 Million Funding for the Massachusetts Legal Assistance Corporation to Support Civil Legal Aid in FY25

CIVIL LEGAL AID IS A LIFELINE FOR MASSACHUSETTS RESIDENTS IN CRISIS.

Legal aid organizations provide essential services that help people across the state meet their critical needs related to housing, employment, health care, domestic safety, and more. The state’s investment in and support for legal aid has helped to serve more residents facing crisis when and where they need assistance the most. Investing in civil legal aid also delivered over \$100 million in economic benefits to the Commonwealth and its residents in FY23.

The need for civil legal aid in FY25: The significant need for civil legal aid remains high with over 50% of qualified applicants still being turned away due to lack of adequate resources. The Commonwealth’s workforce shortage is continuing to impact staffing recruitment and retention at legal aid organizations across the state. The MLAC FY25 Conference budget request of \$53 million will help direct more resources to maintaining, supporting, and expanding staffing to meet rising demand for legal aid services.

People with low incomes are suffering the most from the long-term economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, due in part to the sunset of COVID-era benefits. Numerous other challenges are further exacerbating the problems of poverty, including affordable housing shortages, inflation, and more.



People and families with incomes at or below 125% of the federal poverty level (\$39,000 per year for a family of four and \$18,825 for an individual) qualify for civil legal aid. Census data reveal that approximately 13% of Massachusetts residents meet this requirement.

MLAC is the largest funder of civil legal aid in the Commonwealth. It distributes state-appropriated funding to 16 legal aid organizations across Massachusetts and provides supportive services in the areas of information technology; data and research; hiring and recruitment; diversity, equity, and inclusion; and communications. MLAC also partners with legal aid organizations, bar associations, and the Access to Justice Commission to activate a network of pro bono lawyers and publish legal self-help materials.

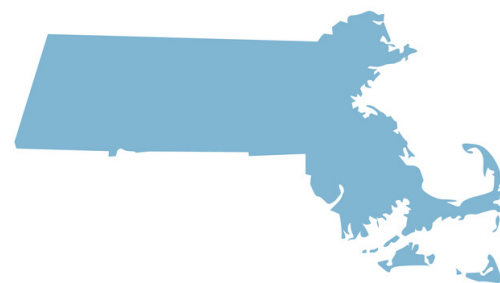
